Celebrate Hanukkah with Bariff Shop style

Dreidels and menorahs with sleek contemporary spins, and a Moses action figure ready to part the Red Sea are among the wide selection of decorative home and fashion accessories for Hanukkah gifts that you'll find at the **Bariff Shop** and Spertus Museum at Spertus Institute of Jewish Studies.

Designs for the home include New York designer Jonathan Adler's menorah and matching vase (\$40 to \$98); Israeli designer Adi Sidler's spiral dreidel (\$38); and Marilyn Davidson's Nambe Menorah (\$150).

For children, there's the Hannukkah Play Set (\$34), the "Ate My Dreidel Romper" (\$27), and the Moses Action Figure (\$10).

To celebrate the start of Hanukkah (this year, it's at sundown Dec. 25), Spertus is holding "Something Else! A Hanukkah Community Festival" from 11 a.m. to 2 p.m. Dec. 25. The festival will include entertainment, puppet shows, trivia games, face painting and food.

NEW MATH: Add modern good looks with midcentury manners and the fashionable sum is **Zocalo's Echo Collection**. Created by designers Jorge Jaramillo and Margaret Leigh, the sleek furniture collection will hit stores in

February. The duo succeeds in making the collection as functional as it is beautiful with soft lines, warm amber patina, bent plywood, simple silhouettes and textured materials such as cross-grained bamboo veneers.

The Lotus Round Dining Table (\$699) also shows off Echo's versatility, transforming from a round to a square table to comfortably seat eight.
